Recently, we honored our volunteers at our Annual Volunteer Recognition Luncheon. The Volunteer Department celebrated its 40th aniversary. Rose Hoffman, our Director of Volunteer Services, reported that during 2015, 249 volunteers served for more than 19,631 hours in countless ways. Thank you for giving selflessly.

St. Paul's continues to grow! Over the past twelve months alone, a lot has been accomplished. We remodelled and opened Jones Serenity Circle to provide personal care in a homelike environment to those residents suffering from dementia. With the opening of Jones Serenity Circle we were able to close the dementia neighborhood (The Meadows) in the Villas where it was in a skilled care setting. The Meadows is now home to our Short Stay Neighborhood for individuals who need a bridge between the hospital and home for additional nursing care and rehabilitation. This Short Stay Neighborhood provides not only private rooms but also additional services and programs designed to enhance care and promote independence. In addition, construction in The Colony, our independent neighborhood, continues to grow. In 2014-2015 we built 11 new homes and more have been added this year. New floor plans and added features and options continue to make The Colony appealing to residents who are independent yet want maintenance free living and the peace of mind knowing there is care available for them later. Lastly, Without Walls, our home-based services continue to grow. Currently we serve more than 180 clients both on campus and in the community with companion and care partner services enabling them to remain in their homes independently.

On June 25th, St. Paul's is hosting a day for the members of the UCC of Penn West Conference to visit our campus and experience life at St. Paul's. I personally invite you to take advantage of this day to explore our campus and witness the mission of St. Paul's in action knowing that you play an invaluable part in our mission.

In July, I will retire after 38 years of service to St. Paul's. This past year I have been working alongside Chris Wright, my successor. Since 2012, Chris has served as our Chief Financial Officer and more recently Chief Operating Officer and will assume the role as CEO in August 2016. I feel with Chris, along with the rest of our management, we are well positioned to meet the challenges that lie ahead. The health care industry is changing at lightning speed and will continue to do so. We are fortunate to have the leaders here that are more than capable to adapt to those changes and ensure that St. Paul's not only continues to be an efficient high quality organization, but to also keep making it even better.

In closing, I just want to thank all of you for your support over the last 38 years. On July 31 I will complete 27 of those 38 years as CEO. I have been very blessed to spend almost my entire career with such a tremendous organization and wonderful people. I wish continued success to St. Paul's and the Penn West Conference and everyone associated with both. May God continue to bless all of you.
