Session One with Pastor Tom Johnson

Tom Johnson is an ordained United Church of Christ minister in the Pittsburgh Association. He is the Head of School, Co-Founder, and Ethics Instructor at the Neighborhood Academy. He previously served as Pastor of Allegheny United Church of Christ in Pittsburgh.

The focus of his first presentation was how we may and should respond to those who are in need. The example he used, with Pastor Matt Deal as the "victim," dealt with the man on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho who had been attacked by robbers. (Luke 10:25-37)

Many thoughtful, reflective, and compassionate responses were heard from the delegates. There are many and diverse ways in which we can respond to those in need. What we can "cobble together" in our faith communities can equip us to do God's work right where we are.
