Theology Course 2023-2024

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Course Objectives:

- 1. To understand and express the connection between the Bible, its interpretation, and theology.
- 2. To identify theological methods, such as constructive, liberation, primary theology, secondary theology, feminist, historical, moral theology (ethics), and so on.
- 3. To engage in practical theological reflection, with a deeper relationship with God being the primary goal.

Optional Text: Gabriel Fackre, <u>The Christian Story: A Narrative Interpretation of Basic Christian Doctrine</u>, Volume 1, Third Edition (Grand Rapids: Eerdman's, 1996). <u>The Christian Story</u> deals with the same information as <u>Christian Basics</u> but in more depth and in an academic way. It is not a required text but a good complement to it.

September 8-9, 2023: Jesus of Nazareth, Part I

Readings for Oct: Fackre & Fackre, <u>Christian Basics</u>, "Jesus Christ," pages 38--63, pay special attention to the diagram 161.

Assignment for October:

- 1. Buy a journal and record your prayer life in it/reflections for the course. This is for you to keep. I will not request it from you.
- 2. Turn in a paper to me that tells me about your relationship to Jesus answering these questions: 1. How do you encounter Jesus most personally? 2. Where does Jesus comfort you? 3. Where does Jesus challenge you?

October 13-14, 2023: Jesus of Nazareth, Part II

Readings for March: Fackre & Fackre, <u>Christian Basics</u>, "pages 64-82. Although the Fackres don't have a chapter in their chart on the Holy Spirit, much of the Holy Spirit material is covered in this section.

Wicks, <u>Seeds of Sensitivity</u>, "Piercing the Darkness," Chapter Six, pages 125-148.

Assignment for March:

Find a picture of Jesus that speaks to you (It doesn't have to speak positively to you; you can dislike it.) Let me know two things about this picture: does it, in your view, demonstrate a 'high' Christology or 'low' Christology? And, which roles (prophet, priest, king, teacher, savior, presence among others) does this work of art express? Either attach a picture of the artwork with your paper or give me a web address where I can find the image online. Why do you think you like this picture/dislike it?

Assignment for May:

1. Use Wicks' method of prayer on page 135 (historically called the prayer of the Examen). Record your thoughts and insights in your journal. Write a paper about Steps 5 and 6 to share with me your insights of how the Holy Spirit might be bearing fruit in your life.
