We are a nonprofit organization that provides both inpatient and outpatient behavioral health treatment, educational services, and other county-funded, residential-based services to youth, young adults, and their families across the commonwealth. Most individuals that we work with have experienced some level of trauma and display behaviors such as self-harm and attempted suicide.

With support from caring donors, Hoffman Homes is a lifeline for youth who may have nowhere else to go for the essential help they need to regain their mental health and foster hope for a brighter future. We offer individual, group, and family therapy along with a variety of Creative Therapy such as Art Therapy, Animal-Assisted Therapy, and Equine-Assisted Therapy. We offer an onsite private academic school, Hoffman Academy, and a 24/7 Medical Services team.



Emergency Shelter

A 15-bed emergency shelter for youth, ages 7-21, in custody of Children and Youth who need temporary placement while they await for a more permanent living situation.

Meet Kai, a youth in care

Born in Alabama, Kai spent her first ten years with her mom. They moved often, state-to-state, to avoid her mother's outstanding warrants. When her mom was ultimately arrested and incarcerated, Kai went to live with her maternal grandparents, while her half-sister was placed with her paternal grandparents. Kai's Nana and Pappy lived in Texas but soon they all moved to Pennsylvania.

Before she came to Hoffman Homes, Kai was psychiatrically hospitalized four times. Overwhelmed with feelings of loss from the repeated moves and separations, Kai started to question why she was living. These negative thoughts led her to attempt suicide several times.

Kai admits to struggling her first few months here, but she soon realized that caring, supportive people were all around her at Hoffman Homes. "This place has really helped me a lot." Kai gravitated to our creative Animal-Assisted and Equine-Assisted Therapies. "You can get everything out [to the animals]. You can talk to them, and they won't talk back." Upon discharge, Kai hopes to talk more with her father. She also wants to spend time with her Nana and make new friends.
