Prelude

Hear these words of Jesus:

I am the resurrection and the life; all who believe in me, though they die, yet shall they live, and whoever lives and believes in me shall never die.

From the Apostle Paul we read: When we were baptized into Christ Jesus, we were baptized into Christ's death. By our baptism, then, we were buried with Christ and shared Christ's death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from death by the glorious power of God, so too we might live a new life. For if we have been united with Christ in a death like Christ's, we shall certainly be united with Christ in a resurrection like Christ's.

As we enter into prayer, I would invite those who are on zoom to write in the chat those saints who have passed into eternal life this year whom you would like to remember this day, and when I pause in the prayer, we will read those names aloud. Following this, those of who are present in the room can speak aloud the names of the saints whom you would like to lift up in prayer and celebration.

You call all your faithful people saints, and even in our imperfection, we are grateful to be called to worship you with honor.

In this hour we remember those who lives have touched the Penn West Conference and those who have faithfully served your church that is covenanted together as the United Church of Christ. We remember especially this day your servant The Rev. Theodore H. Erickson Jr. who entered into eternal life on January 9, 2022. We also remember those faithful servants in our local churches, people who have touched our lives and who through us, have touched the lives of many others. We come before you speaking the names of these beloved ones who have impacted the church and the world in ways that we know and in the many ways that have yet to be known to us. Let us now speak aloud the saints whose lives we celebrate.
